

Roast Apple – Slowly Losing Ground

The new mini-album by the Hamburg band "Roast Apple" invites you to fly.

Finally, the time has come: Roast Apple presents their third EP with 6 songs and stories from the lives of those in their late twenties. After "Take Me Higher" (released in 2022), alongside their usual light and danceable indie pop, Roast Apple also strike a more contemplative tone.

The EP is intended to *"reflect our approach to the small and big, beautiful and not so beautiful aspects of life as young adults. At the same time, we want to spread hope that no matter what, we always have it in ourselves and can even fly if we want to."*

Taking matters into their hands, the band decided to release and promote the mini-album independently and without a label. In addition to financial support from the "Initiative Musik," TV and radio appearances are secured, and various major playlisters are excited about the new songs. The lead single, "Frozen in Time," is probably the most danceable and catchy song on the record, where no foot remains still. The four Hamburgers confess to their roots and their mission to spread good vibes and joy in the world. Catchy funk guitars, groovy beats, and a poppy melody that sticks blend in the production by Henrik Menzel (Udo Lindenberg, Bootsy Collins among others) into a modern indie sound that skillfully brings the dusty disco-funk into 2024.



The second song, "Cheap Perfume," brings lightness, and the accompanying music video by Aaron Omid is a homage to the North German origin and connection to the sea that the four Northfrisians have never lost. "Back Against The Wall" strikes thoughtful notes and processes the singer's experience during and after a panic attack at a concert, culminating in a classic guitar solo that is rarely found today. "Tied Up" describes that feeling that many people in their twenties know all too well: Suddenly being stuck in the working world and being too busy for relationships, old friendships, and hobbies. With the final song, "Crystal," Roast Apple metaphorically finally board their hot air balloon and take off to new adventures. A song that exudes hope and departure and makes you crave more.

About Roast Apple: Four childhood friends are driving through the wide fields of northern Germany in their van late at night. Tired and happy after a successful show in the province. Roast Apple are indeed the antithesis of any major label casting band. Four true childhood friends chasing their dreams together, come what may. Bonded through over 300 concerts, from tiny basement to the big festival stage. For the first gigs in North Friesland, Mom and Dad had to drive them because no one was old enough for a driver's license, but by now Roast Apple stand for a very loyal fan base, proud of over 2 million streams, supporting tours for acts like Dope Lemon & Circa Waves, and an exhilarating sound somewhere between Parcels and Two Door Cinema Club. For several years, Hamburg Altona has become their new home.

Roast Apple stands for danceable and homemade indie-pop from Hamburg, sweat-inducing concerts, and a genuine friendship within the band. The new EP "Slowly Losing Ground" was released on April 26th, 2024, via Believe Digital.
